# Update from the Executive Director

#### I was recently writing a piece on IABC and found myself reflecting on our members and the communication profession.

One of the unifying characteristics I have found among IABC members, and communication professionals generally, is a drive to be change-makers. Maybe it is what pushes people to enter the profession. Maybe they discover it as they grow in their careers and their tenure with IABC, as we collectively focus on how communication professionals are catalysts for better business results and changing the world. Whatever the motivation, it seems to be a core part of who we are and it shapes how we move forward our strategic goals of advancing the profession, creating connection and developing strategic communicators.

This was a year of change at IABC—a year of new. This year we saw the culmination of several strategic projects with the launch of our new association management system, a brand-new <u>iabc.com</u>, and the introduction of a new print magazine and online content center—all on the heels of our recent launch of <u>The Hub</u>, IABC's online community for members and our new corporate membership program.

It was a year of new as we partnered with five new organizations and thought leaders to bring original research and insight to help communication professionals envision the future and start to shape how they prepare for that future. We are stronger together and we will continue to seek opportunities to expand our reach and impact through critical partnerships.

A year of new, as we launched the <u>IABC Academy Business</u> <u>Acumen Certificate</u> to help communication professionals develop a more well-rounded business education so their work and language is that of the business and gains them more visibility in the C-suite. Advanced understanding of the business and business acumen will help move forward our vision of professional communicators at the heart of every organization.



We explored the future and what it will mean to be a communication professional for the next decade and more. We said goodbye to *Communication World* magazine and the CW Observer. The *Communication World* brand has served IABC well and has brought attention to our global nature, which is critical to IABC. And as we looked to the future, a future full of inspired change makers, it became clear that *Communication World* no longer reflected the <u>VUCA</u> environment in which we live and operate or the rapidly changing, broad, results-driven profession we are



and will continue to become. With that, we created *Catalyst*—a print magazine and online content center with ideas and insights for the world's communicators. Partnering with an agency to help deliver the best in creative and inspiration, *Catalyst* launches in June 2019 with two print issues annually, and continuously released digital content to keep insights coming to you year round. As we look to the future, Catalyst has tremendous opportunity to grow with IABC and the profession.

A year of new, as the IABC Foundation awarded its first scholarships for Communication Management Professional (CMP) or Strategic Communication

Management Professional (SCMP) certification through the Global Communication Certification Council (GCCC). The scholarships bring certification to areas of the world where economic disparities may make it difficult to achieve; three of the four scholarship recipients will be the first in their countries to achieve GCCC certification. Sometimes advancing the profession happens one person at a time, until there is critical mass and the change turns the tide. This year saw 69 new certified communication professionals globally, and the momentum keeps growing. We will continue to raise the visibility and reputation of the profession globally by bringing excellence in standards based communication practice through certification offered by the GCCC.

The world works better when we work together. As communication professionals, we have the opportunity to make the world more human and collaborative. We use the power of communication to change lives for the better—to drive better business results. Update from the Executive Director (cont'd)

As we take a breath to reflect on everything that we accomplished together this year, IABC continues to look to the future to see what's next and where our greatest opportunities are to promote the Global Standard, advance the profession, create connection and develop strategic communicators. We continue to look for ways to help IABC members connect the dots between what's now and what's next. 





# IABC Leadership

# The <u>international executive board (IEB)</u> is the governing body of IABC. It is accountable to the members and has supervision, control and direction of the affairs of the association.

It actively pursues the association's purpose and determines its policy within the limits of the law, IABC Bylaws, and Articles of Incorporation. It upholds the IABC Code of Ethics for professional communicators and supervises disbursement of the association's funds. The IEB develops the strategic plan and direction for the association under the guidance of the association Bylaws approved by the IABC membership.
